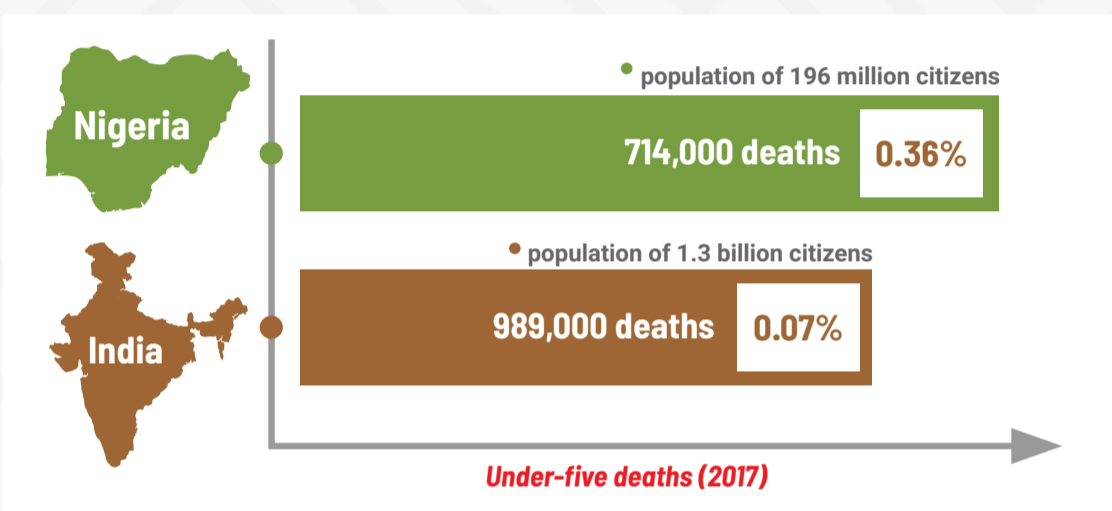
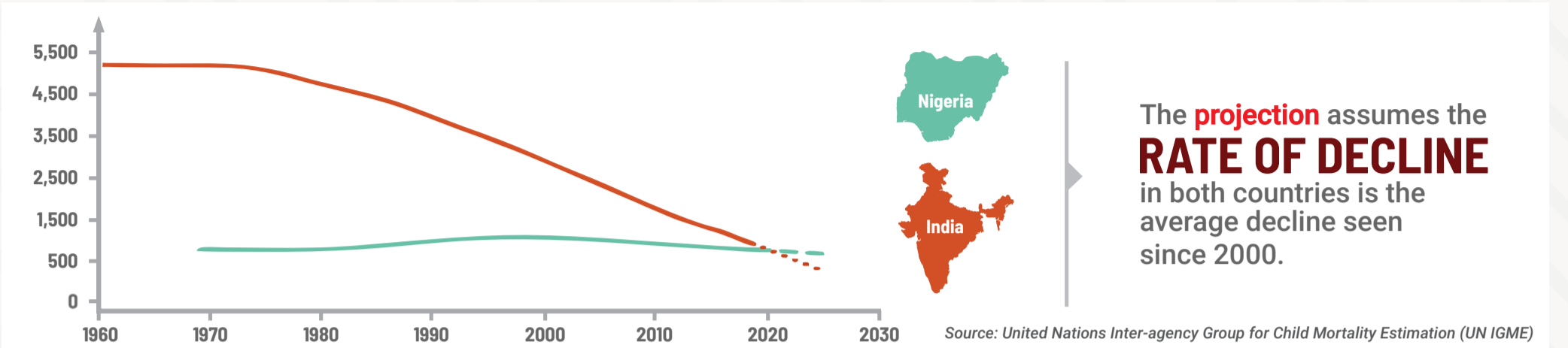




# HEALTHCARE IN NIGERIA 2.0

## #AskYourCandidate

In Nigeria, the under-five mortality rate (U5MR) is reducing but not fast enough<sup>1</sup>. With an U5MR of 107 per 1,000 live births in 2017, Nigeria is projected to overtake India in 2021 as the country with the most under-five deaths in the world<sup>2</sup>.

## HEALTHCARE BUDGET

In April 2001, the African Union countries met in Abuja and pledged to set a target of allocating **at least 15%** of their annual budgets to improve the health sector - **Africa Union's Abuja Declaration**.
